- UCR stands for the Uniform Crime Reporting Program
- Nationwide program to report/collect crime statistics
- Uses a common language

 - Summary- retired at the end of 2020
 - NIBRS

Uniform Crime Reporting

Who participates?

- All Utah Law Enforcement Agencies per Utah Code 53-10-205
 - A law enforcement agency shall, for the jurisdiction of the law enforcement agency, submit crime reporting data required for the statewide uniform crime reporting system described in Section 53-10-202:
 - (a) to the bureau before the 16th day of the month after the month in which a reported crime occurs; and
 - (b) in a manner prescribed by the bureau and in compliance with the requirements of the Federal Bureau of Investigation's uniform crime reporting standards



Participation in Utah

In 2019

- 90 agencies submit NIBRS data
- 39 agencies submit Summary data
- 16 agencies did not submit

In 2020

- 93 agencies able to submit NIBRS
- 13 in transition currently
- 30 still on Summary and 9 non-responding



What is NIBRS?

- National Incident Based Reporting System
- Implemented to improve the overall quality of crime data collected by law enforcement

Summary vs. NIBRS

Summary Reporting

Counts only the most serious offense in an incident

NIBRS (Incident Based)

Counts all offenses that occurred in an incident

Let's try an example

- Three males, armed with handguns, kick open the door to an apartment occupied by a male (age 30) an a female (age 26)
- The first male suspect takes the woman into the bedroom and rapes her, inflicting minor injury
- The other two male suspects ransack the apartment and take a tv, \$500 in cash, and the keys to the male victim's vehicle

<u>Summary</u>: only counts the rape <u>NIBRS</u>: counts the rape, robbery, and burglary

Index Crimes

- 1. Criminal Homicide
 - a. Murder and Non-Negligent Manslaughter
 - b. Manslaughter by Negligence (not an Index Crime)
- 2. Rape
 - a. Rape
 - b. Attempts to Commit Rape
 - c. Historical Rape

- 3. Robbery
- a. Firearm
- b. Knife or Cutting Instrument
- c. Other Dangerous Weapon
- d. Strong-Arm (Hands, Fists, Feet, etc.)

Index Crimes

- 4. Assault
 - a. Firearm
 - b. Knife or Cutting Instrument
 - c. Other Dangerous Weapon
 - d. Hands, Fists, Feet, etc. (Aggravated Injury)
 - e. Simple Assault (not an Index Crime)

- 5. Burglary
 - a. Forcible Entry
 - b. Unlawful Entry No Force
 - c. Attempted
- 6. Larceny-Theft

Index Crimes

- 7. Motor Vehicle Theft
 - a. Autos
 - b. Trucks and Buses
 - c. Other Vehicles

- 8. Arson
- 9. Human Trafficking, Commercial Sex Acts
- 10. Human Trafficking, Involuntary Servitude

Benefits of NIBRS

Help identify crime trends

- Offender trends
- Victim trends


Common locations

- Is there a problem area?
- Target a location type?

Help identify trends earlier and forecast crime

And NIBRS can...

- Identify the use of weapons in the commission of crimes
 - NIBIN- track guns
- Identify the presence of drugs involved in a criminal incident
- Promote officer safety
- Gather Domestic Violence demographics



And NIBRS can...

- Assist Criminal Justice Agencies
 - Enact legislation
 - Expose and improve societal problems
 - Know where to direct resources

Some definitions

Jurisdiction

- Purpose of jurisdiction is to
 - Depict the nature and the amount of crime in a specific area
 - Ensure no duplication of crime data

- Only report offenses that occur within your agency's jurisdiction
 - When two or more agencies are involved?
 - Lead agency reports
 - Unsure who the lead agency is?
 - Determine between each other which will report
 - Most local jurisdiction

Jurisdiction

Arrests

- Only report arrests for incidents reported from your agency
- Group B arrests

Property

 Recovery of property reported by the agency first reporting it missing/stolen

What is an Incident?

One or more offenses committed by the

- Same offender or group of offenders
- At the same time
- Acting in concert

Acting in Concert

Requires:

 All of the offenders to actually commit or assist in the commission of all the crimes in an incident

Offenders must:

 Be aware of and consent to all of the offenses in an incident

Acting in Concert

- NIBRS considers all of the offenders to have committed all of the offenses
- Arrest of any of the offenders will "clear" the incident
- If the offenders did not "act in concert" then there should be two reported incidents

Classifying Offenses

Classifying

- Determine proper crime classification in which to report offenses
- Report only offenses known to law enforcement
 - Identify crime problems faced by law enforcement not courts etc.

Classifying Offenses

Crimes Against Persons

Count one offense for each victim

Crimes Against Property


Count one offense for each distinct operation

Crimes Against Society


Count one offense for each distinct operation


How to participate in NIBRS

- Need an RMS system that supports NIBRS
- Compile monthly NIBRS report
- Become certified
 - When transitioning, files will be uploaded by Alex or Diana
 - Agency must have 4 consecutive months at 4% or less error rate
- Upload to the NIBRS web app
 - Requires submission by the 16th of each month






