### Fingerprinting Services

Fingerprinting services at BCI are still available but are by appointment only. To schedule an appointment, customers will call 801-965-4445 and select option 0. Due to the high demand of fingerprinting services, customers can expect an average wait time of around 30 days. BCI will not make exceptions for UCJIS, POST or law enforcement applicants. For electronic submission of fingerprints, a Live Scan authorization form must be provided at the time fingerprints are taken.

BCI does not provide criminal fingerprinting services. We can only provide fingerprinting for non-criminal justice purposes on federal form FD-258 Applicant Fingerprint Card.

## AMBER Alert and Missing Persons Clearing House

# Uniform Crime Reporting and NIBRS Transition Updates

Beginning January 1, 2021 the Uniform Crime Reporting program will officially retire the Summary program and go solely to an Incident Based Reporting System. Summary agencies will be able to enter their December 2020 data up until January 19, 2021 along with any missing 2020 data. If your agency has not yet begun the transition to NIBRS or has any questions regarding the process and upcoming 2021 changes, please contact either Diana Monago (dmonago@utah.gov) or Alex Martinez (mmartinez@utah.gov). \*Remember it is required for law enforcement agencies to participate in the Uniform Crime Reporting program per UCA 53-10-205(2).

In conjunction with the NIBRS transition, effective January 1, 2021 the following National Incident-Based Reporting System Group B Arrest Offenses will be eliminated:

- 90-A Bad Checks
- 90-E Drunkness
- · 90-H Peeping Tom

Should any 90A, 90E, and/or 90H Offenses be received after January 1, 2021, the FBI UCR System will automatically map the incoming offenses to 90Z.

The FBI's Crime Data Explorer (CDE), which will be the home for Uniform Crime Reporting publications at the Federal level, has a new URL. The new link

### Use of Force Updates

Use of Force reporting is available for all law enforcement agencies through the Use of Force transactions in UCJIS. The FBI's definition of use of force is:

- · When a fatality occurs connected to use of force by a law enforcement officer.
- · When there is serious bodily injury to a person connected to use of force by a law enforcement officer.
- · When a firearm is discharged by law enforcement at or in a direction of a person that did not result in death or serious bodily injury.


The FBI's definition allows for a uniform collection of what is use of force not only in Utah but throughout the United States. 
# New BCI Field Services Regions and Representatives
