## **Utah AMBER Alert Plan**

Administered through the Department of Public Safety, Utah Bureau of Criminal Identification



## Utah AMBER Alert Plan Background:

- Utah adopted the AMBER Alert plan April 2, 2002.
- Originally known as Rachael Alert.
- First Rachael Alert June 5, 2002.
- Utah was the 5<sup>th</sup> state to adopt a statewide plan.
- 73 AMBER Alerts.



### **Utah AMBER Alert Protocol:**


- Criteria is met.
- Law enforcement authorization.
- Contact DPS CIC help desk *before* submitting alert.
  - Mandatory
- UAA transaction on UCJIS entered by agency or dispatch center.
- AMBER Alert transmitted.




#### Utah AMBER Alert Criteria:

- Law enforcement believes it is a child abduction?
- 17 years of age or younger?
- Imminent danger, serious bodily injury or death?
- Agency has enough information to assist the public in the safe recovery of the victim or apprehension of the suspect?








#### **Black-out Window**

 Request has to be submitted through CIC or AMBER Alert coordinators for WEA messages to be sent out if alert is between 10:00 PM-7:00 AM).





#### **Agency Information:**

- Agency phone number should be a number the media and public can contact.
- Authorizing administrator will be the person responsible for authorizing the AMBER Alert.
  - e.g. Lieutenant, Chief or Sheriff.




#### **Abduction Information**

- Date and time should be the exact time of the abduction.
  - If abduction time is not known, please use earliest believed abduction time possible.
  - AM/PM has been added and no military time can be entered now.
- Abduction location should never be the exact physical address or location of the abduction.
- NIC # is not mandatory, but the abducted child should already be entered into NCIC.
- Caution would pertain to the suspect or POI.








#### **Victim Information**

- All descriptors are **NCIC** format.
- DOB and/or age is required but not both.
  - When DOB is not known but there is an approximate age then you would use AGE field.
- Name format is first name last name e.g.
  Yogi Bear.
- Special needs and clothing are free text.
  - o Do not use "Last seen in".
- Special needs would describe medications, disabilities or other life threatening issues for the victim.




#### **Suspect Information**

- All descriptors are **NCIC** format.
- Name does not have to be known.
- DOB and/or age is required but not both.
  - If DOB is not known but there is an approximate age use AGE field.
- Descriptors are **NCIC** format.
- Clothing is free text.
  - Do not use "Unknown clothing", if unknown, leave field empty.
- Identifying marks may include all SMT's or additional features.




#### Remarks Field

- Up to 500 characters for all pertinent information regarding the AMBER Alert
- Make sure to add the name of your agency
- Free text
- Required field








#### Dissemination Screen

Pre selected fields cannot be changed, they are only there to show who and where AMBER Alert will be disseminated to.



## **AMBER Alert: Modify and Cancel**

- Transaction: UAAM
- Each agency is responsible for entering, modifying, and canceling their own AMBER Alert.
  - If for any reason you are unable to modify or cancel the Alert, please contact CIC for assistance @ 801-965-4446.
- Use the remarks field to update the cancellation e.g. "The AMBER Alert for \_\_\_\_\_ is being cancelled. Child has been located safely. Thank you".
  - This is required\*
- When you click cancel, a notice will appear at the top of the screen asking you if you are sure you want to cancel the alert.



### **NCIC Entry**

- The abducted child should be entered into NCIC.
  - It is not mandatory before issuing the AMBER Alert.
- CA (child abduction) should be added in the MNP field until the AMBER Alert is issued.
  - Once issued it should be modified to AA.
  - The caveat will read: AMBER Alert issued for this child.
- Suspect is always to be listed as Wanted, not Missing.
  - If you do not have a warrant for the Suspect, enter them using the Temporary Felony option.

#### **NLETS**

## Out of State AMBER Alert Request

- <u>DPSCIC</u> are the only one that can send an NLETS AMBER Alert.
- If the Suspect or Person of Interest may travel out of state call DPSCIC at 801-965-4446 and request they issue an NLETS AMBER Alert to surrounding states or nationwide.



No Law Enforcement sensitive information should be added to the AMBER Alert e.g. social security numbers, addresses, sexual orientation, driver's license numbers or criminal history, if such information needs to be shared please use a broadcast message to share between agencies.





## **Quick Agency Reminders**

- Mandatory to call DPS CIC at 801.503.5566 and notify BCI that an AMBER Alert is being issued before the alert is sent out.
  - This number is for AMBER Alerts only.
- Each agency is responsible for entering, modifying and canceling their own Alert through UCJIS.
- Only pertinent information that will assist the media and the public in the recovery should be added to the AMBER Alert.
- Alert will stay active until it is cancelled, it does not automatically expire.
- Agency must agree to meet with AMBER Alert Committee after for a review.

## **Endangered Missing Advisory Alert**

- Disseminates to media and law enforcement.
- Missing or Endangered persons that do not meet AMBER criteria.
- Endangered missing person of any age that requires urgency due to the circumstance.



#### **EMA Guidelines**

- Person is missing.
  - o Family believes circumstances are suspicious.
- Person in danger.
  - o Age.
  - o Health.
  - o Environment.
  - Mental Disability.
  - Weather conditions.
  - In the company of a dangerous person.



## **Qualifying Endangered Persons**

- Internet enticed.
- Adult Abduction (18yrs old+)
- Missing college students.
- Persons that have wandered away from care facilities.
- Overdue travelers (weather).
- Autistic individuals.



## **Endangered Missing Advisory Protocol**

- <u>Contact DPSCIC</u> at 801-965-4446 to let them know the EMA is being issued/cancelled.
- Your EMA will go out to all law enforcement so you can add any and all information that they may need.



#### **EMA Dissemination**

- All Utah law enforcement receive the EMA.
- Media signed up will receive it.
- No TOC signs.
  - TOC will activate signs if warranted/serious.
- No email or cell phones will be activated.



## Have you heard of the Ashanti Alert Act?

The Nation Ashanti Alert Act is named in honor of Ashanti Billie, who was abducted and killed in 2017. Ashanti Alerts provide for rapid dissemination of information to law enforcement agencies, media, and the public about adults who have been reported missing, along with suspect information in cases of suspected abduction.

Utah does not have an Ashanti Alert, but the EMA alert is equivalent, meets and exceeds the criteria.
