

So You Have a Missing Person, Now What?



Utah's Public Alerts and Missing Persons are administered through the Department of Public Safety, Utah Bureau Of Criminal Identification

Criteria for Entry

- Agency must have a missing person report on file to support a missing person entry.
- Missing person should be entered into UCJIS as soon as possible.







EM: Message Key - Type of Missing Person

Disability: a person of any age who is missing and under proven physical/mental disability or is senile, thereby subjecting him/ herself or others to personal and immediate danger.

Endangered: a person of any age who is missing under circumstances indicating that his/her physical safety may be in danger.

Involuntary: a person of any age who is missing under circumstances indicating that the disappearance may not have been voluntary, i.e., abduction or kidnapping.

Catastrophe Victim: a person of any age who is missing after a catastrophe.

Juvenile: a person who is missing and not declared emancipated as defined by the laws of his/her state of residence and does not meet any of the entry criteria for the previously listed categories.

Other: A person not meeting the criteria for entry in any other category who is missing and

- 1. For whom there is a reasonable concern for his/her safety **or**
- 2. A person who is under age 21 **and** declared emancipated by the laws of his/her state of residence.





Cautions

A caution indicator should be added when it is known that an individual is armed and dangerous, has suicidal tendencies, has previously escaped custody, is a drug addict, or whatever is appropriate to the particular circumstances of the individual.



Remember, when entering a juvenile, the date of emancipation should be entered, even if the juvenile is not legally emancipated, in which case, date person is turning 18 should be entered.







Personal Descriptions - Required

- Name
- Eye and hair color
- Gender
- Race
- Height and weight

Names:

Complete names if available.

- Should not be abbreviated.
- If the name exceeds 30 characters, use initials of the middle name.

Persons with one name.

- Last name, comma, "X".
- (Prince, X).

Apostrophes are eliminated.

OBRIEN, ONEAL etc.

Compound Surnames:

For compound surnames, the full name including both surnames should be entered. For Example:

*Subject's Name - Jane Smith Jones (not hyphenated).

NCIC Name-SMITH JONES, JANE

*Subject's Name - Jose Rodriguez y Gonzalez (Spanish letter Y used as a separator).





Packing the Record


- Please pack record as much as you can
- Anything searchable should be added to the entry
 - Aliases
 - O OLN
 - FBI Number, etc
- Non-searchable information should be added as well
 - Jewelry
 - Scars, Marks, Tattoos
 - Cautions





Why is packing the record important?

A high-school senior named Hae Min Lee disappeared one day after school in 1999, in Baltimore County, Maryland. A month later, her body was found in a city park. She'd been strangled. Her 17-year-old ex-boyfriend, Adnan Syed, was arrested for the crime, and within a year, he was sentenced to life in prison. The case against him was largely based on the story of one witness, Adnan's friend Jay, who testified that he helped Adnan bury Hae's body. But Adnan has always maintained he had nothing to do with Hae's death.





Criteria for Entry into the Utah Missing Persons Bulletin

The following guidelines must be met before information on a missing or unidentified deceased/living person can be entered into the Utah Missing Person Clearinghouse Bulletin/Web Site.

MISSING PERSON (Information on a Utah missing person or a person missing from another state but believed to be in Utah.)

- The parent, spouse or guardian must contact a law enforcement a
 missing person report. The missing person must be entered into the
 Information Center (NCIC) files by the law enforcement agency.
- A "Missing Persons Clearinghouse Report Form" must be signed, returned to the Utah Missing Person Clearinghouse, Department of Pu S 2700 W, Suite 1300, Taylorsville, UT 84129. Forms can be obtaine Clearinghouse.
- A current original photograph (color preferred) must be received by Person Clearinghouse. (Note: Do not write on the back of the photo.
- All information must be approved by the law enforcement agency re missing person report.
- The Utah Missing Person Clearinghouse personnel will obtain permis law enforcement phone number to contact in the event the person is lo sighting information is received by the Utah Missing Person Clearingh
- 6. In cases of parental abductions, a copy of the court-certified custody the reporting parent has custody must be received by the Utah Clearinghouse. (Note: If it is requested that the non-custodial parent-included in the bulletin, an active felony warrant must be present ir Information Center (NCIC) prior to publication of the photograph). Co investigating officer must be obtained.
- The parent, spouse, guardian or investigating officer must notify the Person Clearinghouse immediately of the location or return of the mis

I agree to hold harmless any agency or department using transmitting, or distributing this information for any errors whatsoever occasioned by misinformation I may supply and to indemnify the Utah Department of Public Safety, all law enforcement agencies, or other organization-s individuals, and contacts or sources of information, and undertake to hold harmless said entities from and against all legal liabilities, including defendants- cost for suits, claims, actions or damages that the reported missing person might prosecute against them.

I agree to notify the Utah Missing Person Clearinghouse and the investigating agency of any updated, new or additional information concerning, the missing person and/or his whereabouts and of any changes in my address or telephone number. I further agree that a photostatic copy of this authorization has the same effect as the original.



Remember

BCI cannot add anyone to the Missing persons website without a signed waiver that includes the agency's missing person's report case number.



 - Add any correspondence that you may have had with that individual








Does Utah have a Missing Persons Database?

 When you click into a missing person record, you will be able to add the correspondence you've had with them.








NamUs

- National Missing and Unidentified Persons System
 - National centralized repository and resource center for missing, unidentified, and unclaimed person cases across the United States.
 - NamUs helps investigators match long-term missing persons with unidentified remains to resolve cases and bring resolution to families.








NamUs

 Law Enforcement can register for free and once granted access, the user will be granted heightened permissions within NamUs to access secure information, manage their own agency cases, and also network with other professionals in the CJ field.







Utah currently has four public safety alerts:

- Utah AMBER Alert
- * Endangered Missing Advisory Alert (EMA)
- Silver Alert
- Blue Alert





AMBER Alert

The Utah AMBER Alert is part of the nationwide AMBER Alert Plan. It is a voluntary partnership between law-enforcement agencies and broadcasters. It utilizes electronic roadway signs, cell phones, and email as methods to alert the public about a missing child and a suspected abductor.

The goal is to instantly activate the entire community to assist in the search for and safe return of abducted children.

Background









- Utah adopted the AMBER Alert plan in April 2002.
 - Originally known as the Rachael Alert for Rachael Marie Runyan.
 - Name changed to match national name in 2003.
- ❖ First Rachael Alert was issued June 5, 2002.
 - Elizabeth Smart.
- Utah was the 5th state to adopt a statewide plan.
- ❖ To date, Utah has issued 73 AMBER alerts for 85 kids.

Protocol

- Criteria is met.
 - Confidently answer yes to all 4 questions.
- **Law enforcement authorization.**
 - Agency's administrative lieutenant, chief, sheriff etc.
- Contact DPS CIC help desk before submitting alert @ 801-503-5566
 - Will need to provide point of contact information for AMBER Alert Coordinator to reach out.
 - Mandatory!
- UAA transaction on UCJIS entered by agency or dispatch center.





What determines an AMBER Alert?

Law enforcement has to consider and confidently answer yes to ALL four items listed in the AMBER Alert criteria, before sending out an AMBER Alert.

If the criteria does not fit the AMBER Alert requirements, then the agency can consider issuing an Endangered Missing Advisory (EMA).

Criteria

- Law Enforcement believes a child or children have been abducted.
- The child or children are 17 years old or younger.
- Law Enforcement believes the victim(s) face imminent danger, serious bodily injury or death.
- There is information that could assist the public in the safe recovery of the victim or apprehension of a suspect.








Request to the Commissioner's Office has to be submitted through AMBER Alert coordinators for for WEA messages during "Blackout window" (10:00 PM-7:00 AM), if approved, the CIC Help Desk will manually activate WEA.





Agency Information

- ❖ Anything with an * is a required field.
- Agency phone should be a number where media and public can reach out with tips and information.
- Authorizing administrator should be the person responsible for authorizing AMBER Alert (e.g. Lieutenant, chief or sheriff).








Abduction Information

- Date and time should be the exact time of the abduction.
 - If abduction time is not known, please use earliest believed abduction time possible.
 - Abduction location should not be the exact physical address or location of the abduction.
- NIC # is not mandatory, but the abducted child should already be entered into NCIC.
- "Caution" would pertain to the suspect or POI.



Notice, if non-family abduction is marked "Yes", a caveat will appear on AMBER Alert to notify the public and media.



Victim Information

- All descriptors are <u>NCIC</u> format.
- ❖ DOB and/or age is required but not both.
 - When DOB is unknown but there is an approximate age then you would use AGE field.
 - Name format is first name last name e.g. Yogi Bear.
- Special needs and clothing are free text
 - Do not use "Last seen in".
- Special needs would describe medications, disabilities or other life threatening issues for the victim.








Suspect/PIO Information

- Name does not have to be known.
- DOB and/or age is required but not both.
 - If DOB is not known but there is an approximate age use AGE field.
- ❖ Descriptors are <u>NCIC</u> format.
- Clothing is free text.
 - If clothing information is unknown, please leave leave field empty.
- Identifying marks may include all SMT's or additional features.








Vehicle Information

- ❖ If a partial plate is all that is known, you can add the PP information.
- If there is no additional descriptors available on the vehicle, utilize the identifier field for dents, dings, cracked windshield, or any detail that can help locate spot vehicle.
- The vehicle information will be the first piece of information that is shown on an AMBER Alert.
- Avoid using abbreviations when entering vehicle information.








Remarks Field

- ❖ Up to 500 characters for all pertinent information regarding the AMBER Alert.
- Agency name should be added at the end.
- Free text.
- * Required field.






Remember

No Law Enforcement sensitive information should be added to the AMBER Alert e.g. social security numbers, addresses, sexual orientation, driver's license numbers or criminal history. If such information needs to be shared please use a broadcast message to share between agencies.








AMBER Alert: NCIC Entry

- ❖ The abducted child should be entered into NCIC.
 - It is not mandatory before issuing the AMBER Alert, but should be done as soon as possible.
- ❖ CA (child abduction) should be added in the MNP field until the AMBER Alert is issued.
 - Once issued it should be modified to AA.
 - The caveat will read: AMBER Alert issued for this child.
 - Automatic notification to the FBI and NCMEC will be sent.
- Suspect is always to be listed as Wanted, not Missing.
 - If you do not have a warrant for the Suspect, enter them using the Temporary Felony option.





AMBER Alert: NLETS

- ❖ If the Suspect or Person of Interest is believed to be traveling out of state with the child, you may call the CIC Help Desk at 801-965-4446 and request the for them to issue an NLETS AMBER Alert to surrounding states or nationwide.
 - The CIC Help Desk are the only one that can activate the NLETS AMBER Alert.
 - AMBER Alert coordinators can reach out to other states' coordinators for guidelines in assistance activating alert in their respective state if necessary.




- Transaction (UAAM) to Modify/Cancel will be the same.
- Each agency is responsible for entering, modifying, and canceling their own AMBER Alert.
 - If for any reason you are unable to modify or cancel the Alert, please contact CIC for assistance @ 801-965-4446.







After alert has been updated with new information, please make sure to select correct option. If alert is cancelled by mistake please reach out to CIC as soon as possible, and let us know.







- Use the remarks field to update the cancellation e.g. "The AMBER Alert for _____ is being cancelled. Child has been located safely. Thank you".
 This is required*.
- ❖ When you click cancel, caveat will appear at the top of the screen confirming cancelation.

(Endangered Missing Alert)

The Endangered Missing Advisory Alert is to be used for endangered or missing persons of any age with urgent needs.

It is a voluntary partnership between law enforcement and local broadcasters to rapidly disseminate information to all of Utah law enforcement agencies, news media, and the public.

This is an alternative solution to situations that do not meet the AMBER Alert criteria.

It is a Utah statewide advisory only, but if the person is believed to be traveling outside of Utah, BCI can send a message using Nlets.





EMA's

Guidelines





- ❖ Do the circumstances fail to meet the criteria for an AMBER Alert?
- Is the person missing under unexplained, involuntary, or suspicious circumstances?
- Is the person believed to be in danger for any of the following?
 - Age
 - Health
 - Mental disability such as Autism or Alzheimer's
 - Environment
 - Weather conditions
 - In the company of a potentially dangerous person
 - Any other factor that may put the person in peril such as: Internet enticed, missing college student, and overdue hikers or travelers

Procedure

- Once the issuing agency determines the guidelines have been met, they must contact the UCJIS Help Desk to let them know the alert is being issued, or cancelled.
 - **@**801-965-4446.
- Missing person should be added into NCIC.
 - Remember, entering a juvenile using the Endangered Runaway message key does not automatically activate the EMA Alert.
- After removing all sensitive information, the UCJIS Help Desk will send an email to all media, the media then decides if they want to broadcast the information.
 - Issuing agency can appoint a Public Information Officer (PIO) to handle the press, and release further information if needed.





Dissemination


- EMA Alert is disseminated to law enforcement through a broadcast message.
 - UCJIS Help Desk will send out an email to the media after removing all sensitive information.
 - ◆ The media will choose if they broadcast the advisory.
 - ◆ If anything else should be shared with them, it should be done by the agency's PIO.
 - No emails or cell phones (WEA messages) will be activated.
 - No freeway signs will be activated unless warranted.


EMA Alert: Entry - UCJIS

Destination: ALL LAW.

Message should begin with: ENDANGERED MISSING ADVISORY.

Then add all of the information on the person along with sensitive law enforcement material if desired. Make sure to add all identifiers such as clothing, jewelry, vehicle, home address and phone.

*Remember to end with your agency's name and contact number.









Message should read something like this:

EMA Alert: Canceling

Transaction: EMA

- When there is no longer the need for the EMA, the issuing agency is responsible for cancelling the advisory.
- To cancel, agency must use the same transaction code that was used to create the alert (EMA).
 - It is very important that when the EMA is cancelled, the issuing agency contact the BCI UCJIS Help Desk and let them know that the EMA is being cancelled.

Destination: ALL LAW

Cancellation message should read:

Ashanti Alert?

The criteria for the Utah Endangered Missing Advisory Alert (EMA) meets and exceeds that of the new national alert known as the Ashanti Alert.

The Ashanti Alert Act is named in honor of Ashanti Billie, who was abducted and killed in 2017. Ashanti Alerts provide for rapid dissemination of information to law enforcement agencies, media, and the public about adults who have been reported missing, along with suspect information in cases of suspected abduction.





Siver Alert

Utah's Silver Alert went live in May 2019, and is an alert notification for missing endangered adults 60 years of age or older and/or individuals with Dementia or Alzheimer's of any age.


The Silver Alert is mandatory if the circumstances meet the criteria.

The Traffic Operations Center (TOC) will light up highway signage in the geographical area where the individual was last seen.

If the law enforcement agency feels more signage is necessary, they may request that by calling the UCJIS Help Desk.







Silver Alert

Criteria



- Individuals with Dementia or Alzheimer's of any age
 - This includes Autistic individuals of any age.
 - Mandatory if the situation fits the circumstances.

Utah's definition of endangered adult and dementia comes from Utah Criminal Code 53-10-702:

- (1) "Dementia" means a person has a form of cognitive decline that significantly affects the person's ability to make decisions and provide for health, safety, or self-care. This term includes Alzheimer's disease and other forms of dementia marked by the continual loss of memory and awareness of surroundings.
- (2) "Endangered adult" means a person 60 years of age or older or a person under 60 years of age who has a form of dementia.





Procedure and Dissemination

- Once the issuing agency determines the guidelines have been met, alert must be issued in UCJIS.
- The Traffic Operations Center will light up signage in the area where the individual was last seen. If the law enforcement agency feels more signage is necessary they can request that by calling the UCJIS Help Desk.


*Please remember no Law Enforcement sensitive information should be added to the Silver Alert e.g. social security numbers, addresses, sexual orientation, driver's license numbers or criminal history, if such information needs to be shared please use a broadcast message to share between agencies.








Authorization Information

- Anything with an * is a required field.
- Agency phone should be a number where media and public can reach out with tips and information.
- Only one of the two questions needs to be answered in order to activate alert.








Endangered Persons Information

- Provide all available information.
 - If you enter the Height and Weight be sure to enter it using three digits.
 - In the Name field, avoid using commas. Spaces can be added as needed.
 - Please note that the Age field is required because of HB 215.
 - Be very specific when providing last known location.
 - In the Description field, include any information that will help in recovering the endangered person. There are no limits with this field.








Vehicle Information

- If suspect is believed to be in a vehicle, you will be able to enter that information in this portion.
 - Avoid using abbreviations in the Make, Model, and Color.
 - If this does not apply to the alert, please leave information fields blank.








I Be aware

Once you hit "SUBMIT", the screen does not change. Exit using the "X" at top right hand corner. If you keep pressing SUBMIT, it will duplicate the alert!

Silver Alert Modify

- Each agency is responsible for entering, modifying, and canceling their own Silver Alert.
 - If new information is found or needs to be changed on the alert, go back using the ESAM transansaction and update it.








Silver Alert Cancel

Silver Alert Cancel




Cancelation reason must be provided, if "Other" is selected, an explanation will need to be included, otherwise it will be rejected.

Please remember to periodically check and make sure all your canceled Silver alerts have been cleared from UCJIS. They don't automatically expire or come off the system!





Blue Alert

The Blue Alert system is to help law enforcement with the means to speed the apprehension of violent criminals who kill or seriously injure local, state, or federal law enforcement officers, personnel, and the community.

It is a cooperative effort between the Department of Public Safety, Department of Transportation, the Division of Emergency Management, broadcasters, law enforcement agencies, and the general public.

It is a Utah statewide alert only. If it is believed that the suspect is leaving Utah, please issue an AM message through Nlets.





Blue Alert

Criteria



- The serious injury or death of a law enforcement officer in the line of duty or,
- An officer who is missing in connection with the officer's official duties or,
- An imminent and credible threat that an individual intends to cause the serious injury or death of a law enforcement officer.

Utah's definition of injured or assaulted from Utah Criminal Code 76-1-601:

(11) "Serious bodily injury" means bodily injury that creates or caused serious permanent disfigurement, protracted loss or impairment of the function of any bodily member or organ, or creates a substantial risk of death.

Or

(12) "Substantial bodily injury" means bodily injury, not amounting to serious bodily injury, that creates or causes protracted physical pain, temporary disfigurement, or temporary loss or impairment of the function of any bodily member or organ.





Procedure and Dissemination


- Agency administrator must approve the alert before it is entered into UCJIS.
- The issuing agency must contact the UCJIS Help Desk at 801-503-5566 to inform them that a Blue Alert is being issued.
- All Utah law enforcement agencies will receive a New Broadcast Message.
- UCJIS Help Desk will email the Media.
- The Media who requested to be notified will broadcast the message.
- The Traffic Operations Control (TOC) may activate the freeway signs if warranted.


Destination: ALL LAW.

Message should begin:

Blue Alert

Then add all information that will assist law enforcement in apprehending the suspect.

*Remember to end with your agency's name and contact number.








Blue Alert: Entry - UCJIS

Message should read something like this:

BLUE ALERT - ARMED SUSPECT PROCEED WITH EXTREME CAUTION. UHP TROOPER SHOT AT MM 137 ON I-15 SOUTH BOUND.

WAS LAST SEEN DRIVING SOUTH ON I-15 IN A SILVER CHEVY MALIBU, VEHICLE LICENCE PLATE NUMBER 123ABC. CONTACT BCI PD UTBCI000 AT 801-965-4446.







Blue Alert: Canceling

Transaction: **EBA**

- When there is no longer the need for the Blue Alert, the issuing agency is responsible for cancelling.
- To cancel, agency must use the same transaction code that was used to create the alert (EBA).
 - It is very important that when the EBA is cancelled, the issuing agency contact the BCI UCJIS Help Desk and let them know that the EMA is being cancelled.

Destination: ALL LAW

Cancellation message should read: CANCEL BLUE ALERT, SUSPECT HAS BEEN LOCATED/APPREHENDED.





Mom calls into agency, reports her and dad got into an argument and he decided to take child on a fishing trip, it has now been a few hours and they have not returned, nor is he answering her calls, should this be an AMBER Alert?

No, this case does not to meet criteria. Just because parents got into an argument does not mean dad has kidnapped child, or he/she is in serious danger.

However, mom's concerns should still be validated, and agency may need to investigate further to decide if EMA should be activated.





Angela calls her local police department and reports that she hasn't seen her roommate, Tina, in a few days. Angela discloses that lately, Tina has been hanging out with a male friend whose behavior has raised a few concerns. She says she called Tina's work and they said she has also been absent for almost a week which is unlike Tina. After searching Tina's room, Angela found Tina's wallet and her cell phone. What alert should the agency submit?

Based on the details provided, Tina appears to be an adult. There's no sighting of an abduction, but there is enough information for suspicious circumstances. The agency has enough to submit an EMA.





Mrs. Sanchez, an elderly 75 year old lady, left to go on a walk early in the morning. It has now been a few hours and she has not returned. When talking to her daughter, she says Mrs. Sanchez has been acting different lately, she appears to be distracted a lot, at times even confused, and forgetting details of her daily life. What alert should your agency issue?

Based on the information provided, this would appear to be a Silver Alert.





A few people outside the mall report seeing a child forced into a vehicle by an adult. The child seemed very scared, was crying and trying their best to pull away. Several witnesses were able to get vehicle plate information and a good description of the child and suspect. Does this meet the criteria for an AMBER Alert?

Yes, based on the details provided, agency has enough to submit alert.





Lisa's dad woke up to find her missing. She is presumed to have disappeared during the night and her parents have no idea where she left to, or if she is was taken. During the investigation they learn she has been in contact with a male adult through online chats, and they have run away together. Lisa is only 13 yrs old, and left on her own will. The law enforcement agency is not sure if this case meets the criteria for an AMBER alert or EMA, which should they submit?

Because she is only 13, Lisa is not of age to give legal consent, therefore this can be considered as an abduction and assume she is in serious danger. If enough information is available to alert the public, agency should send out AMBER alert. Otherwise, an EMA would be appropriate.





Jackson is an autistic teenager who often wanders away from his family when outside at public events. During a youth baseball game, which Jackson and his family were viewing, Jackson seems to have disappeared. After a search in the immediate area, Jackson cannot be found and the family notifies law enforcement.

There is no sign of abduction or immediate danger for Jackson, however; since he is an autistic individual he would qualify for a Silver Alert to be issued on his behalf.
