




Audit Cycle 2024-2027


- We have started our audit cycle
- All CJ agencies will be audited once between now and June 2027
- What you can do to help your agency's audit go smoothly
 - Review your agency's policies
 - Use the correct audit information when searching criminal history
 - Follow correct NCIC procedures



- Requestor Information is logged and audited
- We have noticed an increase in incorrect requestor information used while we have been auditing agencies



- Audit Purpose will be the purpose code that fits why you are querying an individual's criminal history
- Purpose Code C is the most commonly used. For other purpose codes and when to use them, please refer to the III Manual on the TAC website or the Using UCJIS Part One presentation



- The requestor will always be the individual who is wanting the criminal history ran
 - If the judge requests his clerk to run a criminal history, the judge would be the requestor
- Please use first initial last name, first name last name initial, or user ID
 - Avoid using "Judge", "Chief", etc.




- The audit reason should be as unique as possible

Packing the Record

Are the records packed to the best of your agency's ability?

- Checking all available UCJIS files
- Search CAD, Court records, agency case files, etc
- Contact reporting party

NCIC Quality Control Issues

- Are searchable fields being entered properly?
- Is the MIS field being utilized?
- Is the Scars, Marks & Tattoos field being utilized?
- Are records entered in a timely manner?

Second Party Check


- Are you familiar with your agency's second party check procedures?
- What does a second party check entail?

NCIC Hits

- Are hits responded to in a timely manner?
- Are records cleared or canceled in a timely manner?
- Are you familiar with the hit confirmation process?
- Do you know what agency handles your hits after hours (if applicable)?

- Packing the record refers to ensuring that all available information the entering agency has access to is listed on the NCIC record
- This includes, but is not limited to:
 - Aliases
 - State Identification numbers
 - Miscellaneous numbers
 - Scars, marks, and tattoos
 - Miscellaneous field

- Search all available files in UCJIS
 - o MIL
 - You must have access to run each transaction



- Search all available files in UCJIS
 - o MIL
- CAD/RMS
- Court records
- Jail records
- Agency case files
- Reporting party
- Social media

- Why is packing the record important?
 - Assists law enforcement
 - Increases chances of a hit
- What can you do?
 - Double check the entry before having it checked by a second party
 - Have a checklist of files to check when creating an entry







A high-school senior named Hae Min Lee disappeared one day after school in 1999, in Baltimore County, Maryland. A month later, her body was found in a city park. She'd been strangled. Her 17-year-old ex-boyfriend, Adnan Syed, was arrested for the crime, and within a year, he was sentenced to life in prison. The case against him was largely based on the story of one witness, Adnan's friend Jay, who testified that he helped Adnan bury Hae's body. But Adnan has always maintained he had nothing to do with Hae's death.

Timeline

- Jan 13-Hae goes missing
- Jan 14-BOLO issued

- Feb 10-plates were entered
- Feb 28-vehicle was found

Second Party Checks

 Per NCIC, the accuracy of NCIC records is an integral part of the NCIC system. The accuracy of a record must be double checked by a second party. The verification of a record should include assuring all available cross checks were made and the data in the NCIC record match the data in the investigative report

Second Party Checks

- Familiarize yourself with your agency's second party check procedures
- Contact your TAC if you are not sure what it is or where to find it
- Second party checks should include:
 - Cross check all the information in the entry with UCJIS and all other available files
 - Court and jail records
 - CAD/RMS
 - Reporting party
 - Compare data in the entry with the investigative report

- Timely Entry
 - NCIC records must be entered immediately when conditions for entry are met, not to exceed 3 days, upon receipt (electronic or hard copy format) by the entering agency
 - BCI will compare the DTE with the date on the report or warrant
 - Dates that don't match are compliance issues
 - Familiarize yourself with NCIC timeliness definitions. Each file type is different and may need to be entered within 24 hours rather than 3 days

- Incorrect dates
 - We have noticed an increase of incorrect dates on NCIC entries
 - Date of Warrant
 - Date of Last Contact
 - Date of Loss
 - **■** Date of Theft
- These dates assist with increase in hits and identifying that the record or individual is who or what the locating agency found or came in contact with
- These dates should be the earliest possible date

• Example: An individual files a stolen gun report, they state that the last time they saw the gun was between December 1, 2024 - January 1, 2025. The report was made on February 2, 2025. What would the DOT be?

- 2/2/2025
- 1/1/2025
- 12/1/2024

- Example: An individual files a missing person report for their neighbor on September 20, 2024. They aren't sure when was the last time that they saw them. After some prompting from the officer, they say that the last time they saw their neighbor was around the beginning of September 2024, but no later than September 15, 2024. What would the DLC be?
 - 9/20/2024
 - 9/1/2024
 - 9/15/2024

- Missing searchable fields
 - SIDs are not being added to entry
 - SID now has its own field, can add up to 9 in the supplemental



- Scars, Marks, Tattoos
 - We have noticed more NCIC entries are missing scars, marks and tattoos listed on the entry
 - When entering multiple SMT, the most recognizable SMT should be listed on the base entry
 - 9 more can be added into the supplemental
 - BCI recommends listing these from the most recognizable to the least

MIS Field

- We've noticed that this field isn't being utilized as much as it could be
 - **■** Describe scars, marks, and tattoos
 - Describe clothing a missing individual was last seen in
 - Include contact information if hits are being handled by a 24 hour agency
 - Remember, this is a non-searchable field
 - Do not include anything that has its own field

NCIC Hits

- Increase of missed hits
 - Hits are not being responded to within a timely manner
 - Urgent
 - 10 minutes
 - Routine
 - 60 minutes

NCIC Hits

- Records should be cleared or canceled in a timely manner
 - Once the hit confirmation process is completed, the record should be cleared
 - Once a record has been found, the record should be cleared
 - Once a record has been identified as entered in error or having erroneous data, the record should be canceled

PROCEDURE

In accordance with UCA 53-10-108, Gotham City Police Department (GPD) will notify the commissioner and director of the Utah Bureau of Criminal Identification (BCI) upon the discovery of unauthorized access, use, disclosure, or dissemination of a record created, maintained, or to which access is granted by BCI.
